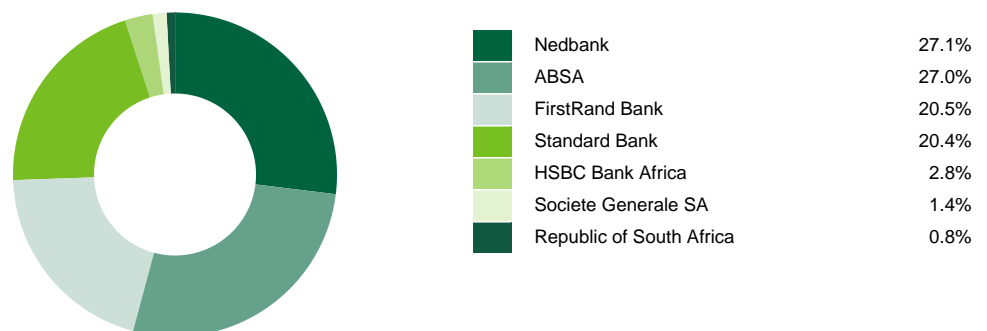

Investment manager commentary

Globally the economic environment appears promising. Second quarter US real GDP growth quickened to 3.1% quarter-on-quarter (annualised), higher than the market expectation. Real GDP growth in the UK expanded by 0.3% quarter-on-quarter in the third quarter. Eurozone industrial production continued to benefit from higher exports and stronger domestic demand. A more hawkish tone from central banks has infiltrated into the FX market resulting in stronger currencies. This is evident in the British pound, Canadian dollar and euro.

Locally the political and policy environment remains toxic. Against market consensus of a 25bp cut reflected in the FRA curve, the South African Reserve Bank (SARB) left the repo rate unchanged at 6.75%. The MPC changed their assessment of risk to inflation from 'broadly balanced' to 'somewhat to the upside'. The MPC members expressed a deep concern for subdued growth rates in the economy. The current account deficit widened to 2.4% (Q2 2017) from 2.0% (Q1 2017). In the face of political turmoil, policy uncertainty and looming downgrades, the exchange rate remains a key risk to the inflation outlook. A challenging political climate and weak consumer and business confidence continue to hamper growth in South Africa.

CPI lifted in August to 4.8% year-on-year from 4.6% in July, breaking the downward trajectory that it has been on. PPI inflation increased to 4.2% year-on-year on the back of upward statistical base effects of the fuel price component along with increase in the international oil price in July and August.

The SARB forecasts inflation to remain within the target range over the six to 12-month horizon. Growth in the money supply eased slightly in August (M3 growth slowed to 6.3% year-on-year in August from 6.8% in July). Although there was a slight improvement in credit growth, the overall number is still relatively weak. Despite the interest rate relief, we believe that household credit growth will continue its modest path as household indebtedness remains historically high. Corporate credit growth will remain subdued as weak business confidence has resulted in business putting investment plans on hold.

There has been a compression in bank spreads over the last quarter. There has been a feeding frenzy on high quality corporate issuances underpinned by strong demand and weaker supply due to the non-issuance of SOE debt. Our base case view is for interest rates to remain flat, with the possibility of more easing in 2018, should growth and inflation remain weak. The fund is well positioned to take advantage of the current interest rate cycle.

The Nedgroup Investments Corporate Money Market Fund is invested 94.89% in the big four South African banks, with 4.30% in South African branches of international banks and 0.81% in South African government and government-guaranteed paper. The fund continues to comfortably outperform its benchmark, delivering a gross return of 0.65% in September 2017.

For the Nedgroup Investments Bravata World Wide Flexible Fund it is calculated monthly as a percentage (the sharing rate) of outperformance relative to the fund's benchmark, with the high watermark principle applying.
